Dear Parents and Gymnasts,

Thank you for choosing U.S.GTC as your child's summer camp! The Gymnastics Summer Camp of New England. CAMP INVOICE

If you have a balance due please contact us immediately to guaranty your child's camp stay. If you are cancelling, please contact us immediately!, so that we can contact your child's roommate. Please call 561-345-8550

REGISTRATION

When: Registration is Sunday of each week from 11:00a.m. until 12:30p.m. If your child is attending both weeks of camp, you will only register once; that first Sunday, August 1.

Where: Registration is held in Kendall Arena which is at the end of Dunlap Street on campus. There will be signs to guide you that read "U.S.GTC Registration".

What is needed at Registration:

- Your child's medical form, if it was not already mailed to us . Also all medications, as they must be checked in with the nurse. Do not mail medical forms after July 15.
We need our medical form on file before a camper can attend camp. This is very important, And no camper can stay at camp without a completed and signed medical form! No exceptions.
- Your child's pretesting questionnaire sheet (for girls only), campers will bring this to the gym after their first dorm meeting, where we conduct the testing program.
- Leave luggage in your car. You will be given a room assignment at registration and then you can proceed to your dorm.
- If your child has any medical issues, please contact us prior to camp, especially food allergies and special dietary needs.

Don't forget your water bottle!!! Getting enough H2O is so important at camp!

Medical Policies: Care of mildly ill campers, administration of medication and procedures for emergency care.

A camper, who becomes ill, will be referred to the medical staff for assessment. If the illness requires a removal from activity greater than that of expected time of recovery for a particular illness, then an injury/illness report shall be completed and it will be determined at that time based on the nature of the illness, to contact the parent/s and update them as to the condition of their child and discuss further treatment options.

All medication will be checked in by the health care provider during the first camp day of each session.

All prescription medications and over-the-counter medications are dispensed by the camp nurses only and as directed in the written signed orders of the individuals physician and parent/s. Campers that require an epi pen or inhaler may have these in their gym bag as described in the camper registration information.

Should an accident occur which would require emergency care, all appropriate measures will be taken to administer first aid. The health care supervisor will make the determination with the consultation of the camp director as to the need for emergency medical care, and the appropriate means for procuring it.
